401	<b>architecture</b> the design and style of building	I like the Gothic style of architecture.
402	<b>construction</b> the work of building or making something especially buildings and bridges	He works in construction.
403	<b>structure</b> the way the parts of a system or object are arranged or organized	The building is a glass and steel structure.
404	<b>institution</b> a place or building where people are sent to be cared for	The man was sent to the mental institution.
405	<b>acquaintance</b> a person that you have met but do not know well	He is not a friend, but an acquaintance.



406	<b>compromise</b> to allow principles to be weakened or your standards to be lowered	They reached a satisfactory compromise.
407	<b>conduct</b> behavior	His conduct of the case was negligent.
408	<b>attitude</b> a feeling or opinion about something or someone, or a way of behaving	The teacher's attitude makes her popular with students.
409	<b>tax</b> amount of money paid to the government based on your income, the cost of goods or services you have bought	Does the price include tax?
410	<b>duty</b> something that you have to do because it's part of your job	It is your duty to take care of your sick parents.

411	<p><b>skill</b></p> <p>an ability to do an activity or job well</p>	Jack has a skill in painting.
412	<p><b>faculty</b></p> <p>the teaching, administrative staff and members of an educational institution</p>	He is one of the faculty members at the university.
413	<p><b>instrument</b></p> <p>a tool that is used for doing a particular work</p>	The shop sells musical instruments.
414	<p><b>implement</b></p> <p>a tool or other piece of equipment for doing work</p>	Stores are not supposed to sell sharp implements to children.
415	<p><b>weapon</b></p> <p>any object used in fighting or war</p>	Soldiers need to have weapons to fight their enemies.
416	<p><b>arms</b></p> <p>weapons and equipment used to kill and injure people</p>	The policemen are always bringing their arms.

417	<p><b>astronomy</b></p> <p>the scientific study of stars and planets</p>	<p>The professor is devoted astronomy.</p>
418	<p><b>thermometer</b></p> <p>a piece of equipment that measures the temperature of the air or of your body</p>	<p>The nurse is looking for the thermometer.</p>
419	<p><b>temperature</b></p> <p>the measured amount of heat in a place or in the body</p>	<p>The doctor examined him and took his temperature.</p>
420	<p><b>track</b></p> <p>a path that is narrower than a road, often with an uneven surface</p>	<p>The runners are on the track.</p>
421	<p><b>scent</b></p> <p>a pleasant smell</p>	<p>I love the scent of roses.</p>
422	<p><b>discipline</b></p> <p>the ability to control yourself or other people</p>	<p>The teacher should maintain discipline in the classroom.</p>



423	<b>experiment</b> a test done in order to learn or discover whether something works or is true	We can only find the best solution by experiment.
424	<b>account</b> a written or spoken description of an event	She gave an account of the accident.
425	<b>solution</b> the answer to a problem	The police are seeking a solution to the crime.
426	<b>truth</b> the real facts about a situation	He was telling the truth.
427	<b>arithmetic</b> the process of calculating numbers	When you study arithmetic you learn to add, subtract, multiply and divide.
428	<b>electricity</b> energy that can produce light and heat, or make machines work	Elevators are operated by electricity.

429	<p><b>analysis</b></p> <p>a particular study or examination of something</p>	A sample of blood was sent for analysis.
430	<p><b>issue</b></p> <p>a subject or problem which people are thinking and talking about</p>	She is concerned about environmental issues.
431	<p><b>instruction</b></p> <p>something that you have been told to do</p>	The teacher gave strict instructions to the students.
432	<p><b>incident</b></p> <p>an event, especially which is bad or unusual</p>	The incident has ruined his career.
433	<p><b>phenomenon</b></p> <p>something that exists or happens, usually something unusual</p>	Hurricane is a violent natural phenomenon.
434	<p><b>thread</b></p> <p>a long, thin piece of cotton, wool used for sewing</p>	Pass the thread through.



435	<p><b>clothes</b></p> <p>something that you wear on your body</p>	The woman is washing her clothes.
436	<p><b>aspect</b></p> <p>one part of a situation, problem, or subject</p>	You must consider the problem from every aspect.
437	<p><b>evidence</b></p> <p>anything that helps to prove that something true or not</p>	The policemen haven't found any evidence.
438	<p><b>certificate</b></p> <p>an official document that gives details to show that something is true</p>	The school asked the students to submit their birth certificates.
439	<p><b>necessity</b></p> <p>the need for something</p>	TV set is a necessity in the modern house.
440	<p><b>exception</b></p> <p>someone or something that is not included in a group</p>	I like all kinds of films with the exception of horror films.

441	<p><b>emphasis</b></p> <p>particular importance or attention given to something</p>	<p>My English teacher puts great emphasis on grammar.</p>
442	<p><b>detail</b></p> <p>a single piece of information or fact about something</p>	<p>We don't know the full details of her plan.</p>
443	<p><b>method</b></p> <p>a particular way of doing something</p>	<p>He advised us to use a new method in teaching.</p>
444	<p><b>means</b></p> <p>a method or way of doing something</p>	<p>She needs to find other means of communication.</p>
445	<p><b>measure</b></p> <p>a unit used for stating the size, weight, etc. of something</p>	<p>We must take certain measures to stop the increase in crime.</p>
446	<p><b>height</b></p> <p>the distance from the top to the bottom of something, or the quality of being tall</p>	<p>She has a medium height.</p>



447	<b>length</b> the measurement of something from end to end	An inch is a measure of length.
448	<b>depth</b> the distance down from the top surface of something to the bottom	There is a thirty feet depth of water.
449	<b>strength</b> the ability to do things that demand physical effort	I don't have the strength to lift this box.
450	<b>force</b> physical power or strength	He used all his force in opening the window.

451	<p><b>degree</b></p> <p>an amount or level of something</p>	This job demands a high degree of skill.
452	<p><b>characteristic</b></p> <p>a specific quality that makes a person or thing different from others</p>	They have one characteristic in common.

461	<b>notion</b> a belief or idea	He has no notion of economy.
462	<b>view</b> a way of thinking about something	You and I have different points of view.
463	<b>sight</b> the ability to see	Many stars are invisible to human sight.
464	<b>article</b> a piece of writing in a magazine or newspaper	I have read an interesting article in the newspaper today.
465	<b>surface</b> the outer or top part of something	The surface of the road is rough.



466	<p><b>bottom</b></p> <p>the lowest part of something</p>	<p>The ship has sunk to the bottom of the ocean.</p>
467	<p><b>current</b></p> <p>the natural flow of air, water, or electricity in one direction</p>	<p>He was swept out to sea by the strong current.</p>
468	<p><b>horizon</b></p> <p>the line in the distance where the sky seems to touch the land or sea</p>	<p>The moon is rising above the horizon.</p>
469	<p><b>dawn</b></p> <p>the period in the day when light from the sun begins to appear in the sky</p>	<p>In summer dawn comes early.</p>
470	<p><b>twilight</b></p> <p>the time just before it becomes completely dark in the evening</p>	<p>He usually comes home in the twilight.</p>
471	<p><b>voyage</b></p> <p>a long trip, especially by ship</p>	<p>Life is often compared to a voyage.</p>



472	<p><b>landscape</b></p> <p>the appearance of an area of land, especially in the countryside</p>	<p>On top of the mountain, you can see beautiful landscapes.</p>
473	<p><b>continent</b></p> <p>one of the seven large land masses on the earth's surface mainly surrounded by sea</p>	<p>Asia is one of the continents of the world.</p>
474	<p><b>heaven</b></p> <p>a situation that gives you great pleasure</p>	<p>Lying in the beach is heaven for me.</p>
475	<p><b>hell</b></p> <p>an extremely unpleasant or difficult place, situation or experience</p>	<p>The war made our lives a hell.</p>
476	<p><b>globe</b></p> <p>the world</p>	<p>He has traveled all around the globe.</p>
477	<p><b>origin</b></p> <p>the beginning or cause of something</p>	<p>Samba is a quick dance of Brazilian origin.</p>



478	<p><b>resource</b></p> <p>a useful or valuable possession or quality of a country, organization or person</p>	They developed their natural resources.
479	<p><b>treasure</b></p> <p>wealth, usually in the form of a store of precious metals, precious stones or money</p>	Pirates are interested about buried treasures.
480	<p><b>ancestor</b></p> <p>any member of your family from long ago</p>	Mary saw portraits of his ancestors on the walls.
481	<p><b>heir</b></p> <p>a person who will legally receive money, property or a title from another person</p>	Mark was chosen as the new heir.
482	<p><b>fault</b></p> <p>a mistake, something for which you are to blame</p>	It's my fault that we were late.

483	<p><b>biography</b></p> <p>the life story of a person written by someone else</p>	Have you read the new Roosevelt biography?
484	<p><b>species</b></p> <p>a group of plants or animals which share similar characteristics</p>	Over a hundred species of insect are found in this area.
485	<p><b>evolution</b></p> <p>the way in which living things gradually change and develop over millions of years</p>	In school, we learned about Darwin's theory of evolution.
486	<p><b>progress</b></p> <p>development and improvement of skills and knowledge</p>	I'm making progress with my English.
487	<p><b>instinct</b></p> <p>the way people or animals naturally react or behave without having to think</p>	Animals act on instinct.



488	<b>impulse</b> a sudden feeling that you must do something, without thinking about the results	Nick bought the car on impulse.
489	<b>emotion</b> a strong feeling such as love or anger	Her emotion rises to the climax.
490	<b>sentiment</b> a general feeling, attitude, or opinion about something	Maria shows sentiment about the boy's problem.
491	<b>pity</b> sympathy and understanding for someone else's suffering or troubles	I pity my friend because she fails in the exam.
492	<b>sympathy</b> understanding and care for someone else's suffering	We feel sympathy for poor people.

494	<p><b>anger</b></p> <p>a strong feeling which makes you want to hurt someone</p>	<p>His voice was shaking with anger.</p>
495	<p><b>passion</b></p> <p>something that you are strongly interested in</p>	<p>She has a passion for music.</p>
496	<p><b>desire</b></p> <p>a strong feeling that you want something</p>	<p>All people desire happiness and health.</p>
